


For this lesson, make sure you have your plans from earlier this week and information about the chocolate making stages from last week.

Task One: Explain what a fronted adverbial is. Then match the fronted adverbial with the correct clause.

Once the pods are ripe,	the beans turn from white to brown.
Gradually,	around 30-50 beans grow.
Inside the pods,	they are chopped down with a machete.

Here is the success criteria for your paragraph about harvesting:

Task Two: Here is Mr Spotwood's paragraph. Can you check that he has used a fronted adverbial, a conjunction and that he has written in the present tense. Underline where he has done these things.

Once the farmers have gathered all the pods, they split them open and carefully scoop out the beans. On average, there are 30-50 almond sized beans inside each pod. In addition, the beans are white and pulpy at this stage. In order to ship them, they must be fermented and dried.

Task Three: You are now going to write two paragraphs. Your first paragraph needs to be about the harvesting stage and your second paragraph needs to be about the roasting stage. Remember to use your plan and the success criteria above.
